I, Gregory V. Serio, Superintendent of Insurance of the State of New York, pursuant to the authority granted by Sections 201, 301, 2325 and Article 23 of the Insurance Law, do hereby promulgate the following Fourth Amendment to Parts 105, 106, 107, 108 and 109 of Title 11 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York (Regulation No. 30), to take effect upon publication in the State Register, to read as follows:
